

STUDENT CONDUCT ON SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION

While the law requires the school district to furnish transportation, parents are responsible for supervision until the student boards school transportation in the morning and after the student leaves school transportation at the end of the school day.

Written guidelines for student conduct on school transportation shall be distributed to students. Students shall be required to conduct themselves on school transportation in a manner consistent with the established standards of behavior.

When a student does not exhibit proper conduct on a bus, the building principal shall be notified in writing by the bus driver.

Any offense committed by a student on district-owned or contracted transportation shall be punished in the same manner as if the offense had been committed at the student's assigned school.

Students who become a serious disciplinary problem on school transportation will have their riding privileges suspended by the principal. In such cases, the parents of the children involved become responsible for the transportation of their children to and from school.

Students with disabilities will be disciplined in accordance with their Individualized Education Program (IEP) or applicable law.
