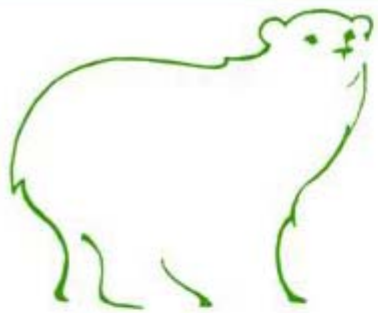

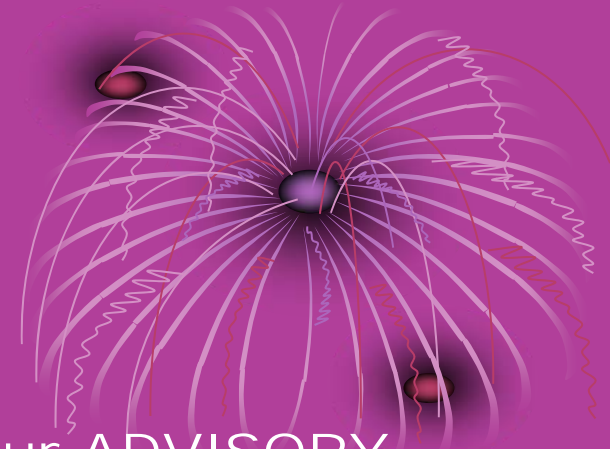
Students are encouraged to apply to the A+ Program early in high school; however, students may apply to the A+ Schools Program through November 1st of their senior year. Applications are available in the A+ Office at Rock Bridge and on the Internet at the address below.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Assuming that state funds are available from the state, Rock Bridge High School A+ graduates will qualify to receive the A+ Student Financial Incentive if they meet the following requirements:

1. Enroll in the A+ Schools Program (Complete an A+ Schools Program application).
2. Attend a designated A+ School for three (3) consecutive years prior to high school graduation.
2. Graduate from high school with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale (grades 9-12).
3. Have at least 95% attendance record (grades 9-12).
4. Perform and document fifty (50) hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring (coordinated by RBHS A+ office)
5. Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs and alcohol.
6. Submit a FAFSA form (2nd semester of senior year)
7. Registered for Selective Service (male over age 18)

Frequently asked questions:



- Q: Do I have to take Personal Finance next year or can I wait until my Senior year?
- A: The district has mandated that all students must take Personal Finance during their Junior Year or during the summer prior to their Junior Year. There are summer school options for students wanting to take Personal Finance online or in a classroom in the summer (see Summer School application packet in Guidance)
- Q: If I already have all my English/Language Arts credits do I have to take US Studies?
- A: Yes. US History is a graduation requirement, so you must take US Studies as a junior to fulfill that graduation requirement.
- Q: Can I take PE online?
- A: Yes, there are online PE programs through BYU High School or MU High School. These classes are an additional cost.

Frequently asked questions:



- Q: How do I know what classes/credits I still need for graduation?
- A: You can view your transcript and current credits on HomeAccess. You will also be meeting with your counselor starting the week of Feb. 14th to review your requests. We will go over credits and graduation requirements again at that time.
- Q: Will I get all the classes that I sign up for?
- A: These are course *requests*- not your official fall schedule. We try hard to help students get their first choices, but often times there are schedule conflicts and this is not possible. This is why it is so important to include several course alternatives when entering your course requests.
- Q: If I don't get my first choices, can I just change my schedule in the fall?
- A: Unfortunately, it is extremely difficult to change schedules once they are created. If a student has a full schedule with all their core courses/graduation requirements included, they will not be able to change their schedule during course pick up. They may schedule an appt. w/counselors in August but need to be aware, it will be difficult to make changes.
