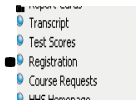



A+ SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Rock Bridge High School is a part of the **A+ Schools Program**. This program is designed to guide students in a rigorous program of academic and technical education that will prepare them for the workplace, post-secondary vocational/technical training, or college. The goals of the **A+ Schools Program** are that all students will:

1. Graduate from high school.
2. Complete a selection of high school studies that is challenging and has identified learning expectations.
3. Proceed from high school graduation to college or a post-secondary vocational/technical school or a high-wage job with skill development opportunities.

All Rock Bridge students are encouraged to sign-up to be a part of the program in the A+ office by November 1st of their senior year. Participation in the **A+ Schools Program** may qualify students to receive an **A+ Financial Incentive** (Two years of fees and tuition at any Missouri public two-year community college or vocational /technical school. This is contingent upon availability of funding and appropriation by the Missouri State Legislature).

To qualify for an **A+ Financial Incentive**, a student must:

1. Complete a written A+ Schools Agreement (Applications available in Guidance and on RBHS website).
2. Attend an A+ designated school for three consecutive years prior to graduation.
3. Graduate from high school with at least a 2.5 GPA (cumulative average 9-12 grades).
4. Have at least a 95% attendance rate for the four years of high school (cumulative average 9-12 grades).
5. Perform 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring in a CPS classroom (coordinated by the RBHS A+ office). No more than 12.5 hours of the tutoring/mentoring can include job shadowing experiences.
6. Maintain good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs and alcohol (9-12 grades).
7. Earn a score of Proficient or higher on the Algebra1/Integrated Math 1 End of Course Assessment (2015 graduates and beyond)
8. Attend a Missouri community college or post-secondary vocational/technical school on a fulltime basis and maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher.
9. Submit a Free Application for Financial Student Aid (FAFSA) form (second semester of their senior year)
10. Have registered for Selective Service (male U.S. citizen over age 18)
